of regular equipping of the members.

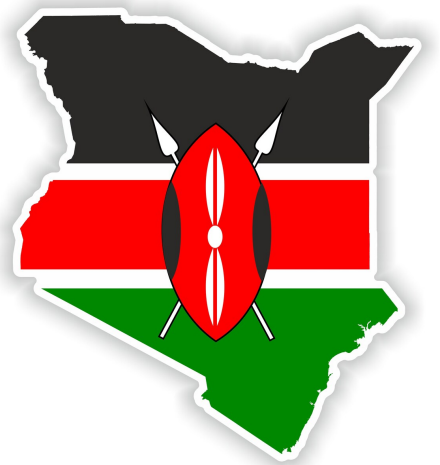
Samuel Njogu, therefore, spent much time in visiting several Chapter members and taught them on the following:-

The meetings, though sporadic, were very effective. The committed members, who were trained in various venues around their Chapters, identified several open doors and set to plan on how to organise outreaches with support from the BMF Leadership.

OUTREACHES IN JULY

1. Gikambura Chapter Outreach. On Saturday 5th from 2pm to 4pm.

Venue: Gikambura Deliverance Church where over 100 men attended, mostly the less fortunate members of the community.

Speakers: John Gathecha and Samuel Njogu.

Remarks: Some well-wishers from the Good Samaritan Ministry provided foodstuffs and clothes to the less fortunate members of the community who had attended the meeting.

Salvation: About 70 men responded to the prayer for salvation.

2. Kikuyu Town Outreach on Tuesday 15th from 12pm to 3pm Venue: Administration Offices.

A team of men led by Samuel Njogu visited the Administration Offices to share their testimony to Government officials.

We also visited the Police Officers who were injured during a recent demonstration in Kikuyu Town that resulted in burning down of Administration Offices and the Kikuyu Law Court buildings. We prayed with the Government officials and planned several community outreaches beginning the month of August.

3. Prayer Meeting

Friday 25th from 10am to 5 pm. Venue - House of Praise Retreat Centre Hall.

16 members mostly drawn from those who committed to work more closely with BMF leadership attended.

We had a wonderful time praying for upcoming outreaches.

4. CHAPTER OUTREACH TRAININGS.

To ensure that the outreaches and discipleship programme becomes sustainable, Samuel Njogu and

the BMF officials spent a better part of July training members who are willing to participate more directly in planning and speaking in outreach meetings.

Several members committed to actively take part in active outreach/ discipleship work.

Report on BMF- UGANDA work for July 2025.

REPORT ON BMF - UGANDA WORK FOR JULY 2025.

On 27th July, Kasamba Jacob and Tumukunde Jimmy went to Lake Katwe Prison for the discipleship programme and they taught 78 men from the book of Rev.3:14-20.



On 28th July, Jude Musisi and I went to Nebbi Prison. We arrived there at 3pm after driving for seven hours. We were a little bit tired, and we rested for 20 minutes in the Office of the O.C to have the drinks and the snacks we packed. The O.C asked the Officer on duty to assemble all the men outside in the compound to listen to us, Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 481 men received salvation out of the 536 men who were present. Jude opened his Bible afterwards and ministered from the Book of John, Chapter 1:29, explaining to them that, the Lamb of God they have accepted today washed away their sins. We prayed for all those who had health issues afterwards and am sure that many got healed. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 29th July, Jude Musisi and I went Paidha Prison. We arrived there at 9:00 am when the inmates were inside their cells. The Officer on duty assembled all the 319 men enrolled in that unit outside in the green compound. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story, 287 men received salvation, 5 of whom were Muslims. Jude gave them some facts from the Bible, proving to them that Islam can't take any person to heaven.

We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end. We left the Prisons at around 1pm, driving to the Trading Centre, where we had to sleep that night, but unfortunately the car we were using overheated and destroyed some parts of the engine. It took the engineer five hours to buy and fix those parts so that we could proceed, but by the grace of God we arrived safely.

On 30th July, Jude Musisi and I went to Amalata Prison. We arrived there at 8am when the inmates were still in the morning assembly as we planned it a day before with the O.C. They invited us immediately to take over because they went to take the inmates out for labour work. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 273 men received salvation out of the 296 men who were present. Jude shared with them some Scriptures about salvation of men. We prayed for two men who came out for prayer.. One had much pain in his left leg caused by nerve injuries. After praying for him, the pain disappeared. Another one was shivering due to fever. He also felt better after praying for him. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 30th July, Kasamba Jacob and Tumukunde Jimmy went to Rusese Prisons for the discipleship programme and taught 48men, The Holy Spirit had spoken to Jacob to teach from the book of Revelation.3 :14- 20 by showing him the present state of life in which those men are in now, which looked like that of the church in Laodicea.

No. Of men reached in July 2025 = 1,201.

No. Of men received salvation in July 2025 = 1,041.

No.Of men reached since 2008. = 114,525.

No.Of men received salvation since 2008= 90,232.
