## **BMF KENYA AUGUST 2023 REPORT**

### **1. ONDIRI NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION CHAPTERS FORMATION AND OUTREACHES**

Throughout the month of August I went together with some of the officials of the planning committee around the Ondiri area to set up Chapters. We mapped out the area according to the road network and came up with 31 Chapters. We further asked the area residents to attend their Chapter meetings in order to plan for outreach meetings and to appoint 3 leaders in each Chapter who will steer the outreach and the Chapter activities. I. JOHN MAKUMI'S HOME OUTREACH – Saturday 19<sup>th</sup>, 7 pm to 10 pm. The meeting was well attended with about 30 people i.e men and their families. There was a considerable number from the Catholic Church in the area, present. I was the main speaker and Francis Gichanga was the Master of Ceremonies. About 7 men responded to the prayer of commitment to Jesus Christ

II. CHARLES NDEGWA'S HOME – Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup>, 4 pm to 6 pm. The neighbourhood meeting was scheduled to console this family which had lost their son. We were about 70 people, i.e Chapter members of Nyamu Chapter and their families. We met in a hired tent within the compound. I was the main speaker and Francis Gichanga was the Master of Ceremonies. We prayed for the family, and about 20 men responded to the commitment to follow Jesus. A number of those who attended were families that had recently lost their loved ones. I took time to encourage these families from the Scriptures and the testimony of God's grace upon my life and family after the passing on of our daughter to the Lord. The next neighbourhood outreaches in Ondire are as follows; - Francis Gichanga's home on 2nd September from 7 pm to 10 pm - Samuel Njogu's home on 16th September from 7 pm to 10 pm.

III. ONDIRI YOUTH OUTREACH EVERY SUNDAY 1.11 am to 12:30 pm. The youth meetings have continued to take place every Sunday at the Presbyterian Church Resource Centre hall. A total of 150 youths have attended the meetings this month, with 28 of them accepting the Lord. Being a school holiday month, we registered more attendance among the youth.

2. SUNDAY 13<sup>th</sup>, MURANGA OUTREACH MEETING 1 pm to 4 pm. The meeting was organised by the leaders who have been attending the monthly leaders conference. We had an attendance of about 200 men. The meeting took place from 2.30 pm up to 4:30 pm. About 30 pastors and leaders from the area were present. James Mwaura (the host) was the Master of Ceremonies and I was the main speaker. Over 100 men responded to commit their lives to Jesus Christ Next Leaders Outreach meeting on Friday 22nd September. We are planning to train more leaders in order to set up Chapters and also to effectively reach schools in the area.

3. WEDNESDAY 16th MAIAIHII YOUTH OUTREACH The meeting took place at Wambaa Primary School. It was planned with the support of the Presbyterian Church in MAIAIHII Parish. They provided footballs and other sports items for the youth and lunch. Wambaa Primary School provided the venue. We had about 300 youths and children ranging from 5 to 18 years. The sports session started at 10:00 am and went all the way to 1 pm. There was a 1 hour lunch break and then the youths congregated in a nearby Church hall at 2 pm. There were testimonies from three youths and then I gave my testimony for about 30 minutes. About 150 youths responded to a commitment to follow Jesus and I prayed for them. This was followed by a very good session where the youths got into prayer for their families and other needs. They all prayed for about five minutes. This was a very uplifting

time for all of us in BMF and the organisers to see the young people turning to the Lord. There is a serious attack on the youth in Kenya. Quite a number are bound in drugs, sexual immorality and crime. The Lord is speaking to us that we should save this generation for the Kingdom of God. Let us pray for this generation and avail ourselves to reach them - Psalms 2:8 "Ask of Me, and I shall give thee the heathen for thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession."

#### 4. FRIDAY 18th TO 20th KIAMUMBI OUTREACHES

I. FRIDAY OUTREACH A team of 10 men from Embakasi Chapter came together and linked up with an Anglican Church in an area called Kiamumbi to reach out to the area. We went out into the area, visiting the business premises and talking to small groups of people who included business owners. We divided ourselves into three groups. We shared our testimonies and led those willing to follow Christ for about 2 hours. This new approach to outreaches was very good because we managed to interact and engage the business men in a more deeper way. We started out at 11 am up to 1 pm and then congregated for lunch. Each team came back with a positive report concerning those who accepted the Lord. They provided names and contacts of the new believers. We returned into the field again after lunch, from 3 pm up to 5 pm. We then came together, reported and then held a service at the ACK Church from 6 pm to 8 pm. Some leaders and members of the ACK Church joined us. We had the three team leaders reporting on their outreach experiences and results. On that day, a total of 53 people gave their lives to Christ. We submitted the list to the Church Vicar who was present and asked the Church leaders to set up a follow up programme. I then ministered to those present about the power in the blood of Jesus. Many were very encouraged to learn that through the blood of Jesus, the devil is judged, we have been redeemed, we have been made sons of God, we are healed and we have been made partakers of God's blessings (inheritance)

II. SATURDAY OUTREACH We had the same kind of outreach on this day and the team reported that 42 people responded to follow Jesus. At some time I left the team to attend a Government meeting in the Karai area. Present in this meeting was the Kiambu County women representative, the wife of the Deputy President of Kenya (a believer in Christ who has a burden for men and families to be saved), local Government church pastors, and invited men from the area. I did not get a chance to speak, but several leaders aired their opinions to the Government leaders on the need to reach out to men. The meeting took place in the same grounds where BMF had held a men's outreach with over 2,000 men in attendance, in 2011. Therefore many local people present recalled this and wondered why the organisers (local pastors) failed to give BMF a chance to participate in the programme. Evanson and I went into a restaurant to have lunch. The Spirit of the Lord came upon him and he started prophesying to me that God will link me up with the Governor of Kiambu County very soon. He also advised me to prepare a profile of our past, present and future projections in BMF. I prepared the profile and printed it on the same day without knowing that my meeting with the Governor would take place the following day.

III. SUNDAY SERVICE I went to Kiamumbi and arrived at the ACK Church at 9:30 am. Surprisingly the Kiambu Governor had just arrived in the same Church a few minutes before, accompanied by many of his staff and members of the County Assembly. I was told that he had just called that morning indicating that he would visit the church for a service. I had an opportunity to witness for Christ before the entire Kiambu County leadership. When I asked those who wanted to receive Christ to stand up, about 20 people stood, including a Muslim woman who had come to Church to surrender her life to Jesus. There were about 200 people. The Governor told me that the message had touched his life in a special way. I later gave the BMF profile to him and he promised to give me an appointment to meet him and explain more about BMF and how the County can offer more opportunities for outreaches within the County including permits to schools and other Government

institutions. Let us pray that more doors will open through this connection. Let us thank God for granting us an opportunity to impact the County leadership with the Word of God.

## **5. SCHOOLS OUTREACHES**

I. SUNDAY 6TH NAARO HIGH SCHOOL A team of 10 men from various BMF Chapters went to Naaro High School for a Sunday service and an outreach/ follow up programme. The Church service was held from 8:00 am to 10:30 am with about 500 students present. Each one of the men shared their testimonies very briefly. I then shared my testimony and then did an altar call. About 50 students responded. After the service, and the students went for a tea break, a one on one counselling session was arranged where each of us sat behind a desk and two chairs, and waited for students that needed counselling to come. The students came to each of us and we counselled them individually on issue to do with drugs, sexual immorality, depression, suicidal thoughts and academic problems. 30 more students received Christ during counselling while we managed to counsel about a hundred of them collectively. The next outreach and follow-up programme in the school will be on 1st October. Let us pray for more members to participate in the team

### **II. FRIDAY 11TH WAMBAA PRIMARY SCHOOL OUTREACH**

BMF in conjunction with the school board planned an outreach meeting for the students, parents and the school alumni. The parents contributed finances for lunch, tents, chairs and prizes for the good performing students. The meeting was very well attended. Over 500 parents and Alumni were in attendance. The meeting was held from 11 am up to 1 pm. The Master of Ceremonies was Frederick Mugo who was a former student of the school. Three other former students shared their testimony. I also shared my testimony and the main speaker, Philip Kigathi, shared his testimony. Over 150 parents responded to the call of salvation.

## **6. OTHER UPCOMING MEETINGS FOR PRAYER**

I. SHEPHERD FM RADIO OUTREACH PROGRAMME. I will share my testimony and then talk more about BMF vision. Other BMF members will also attend to share their testimonies 1, 15, 29 September.

II. LEADERSHIP CONFERENCES. These are conferences intended to train co-workers in BMF work 7, 22, 30 September.

III. CHURCH MEETINGS Invitation to teach and introduce BMF vision 10, 17, 24 September..

## **PRAYER REQUESTS**

I. Government collaboration. On 3rd we participated in a Government function and also had a connection with the Kiambu County Governor on 19th August Sunday service. Let us pray that more doors will open within Government institutions and the community through these collaborations.

II. School team. We hope to expand our schools outreach team by inviting more volunteers into the programme.

III. Leadership Conferences: We hope to equip more co-workers in the outreach work by training them. Let us pray for the Leadership Conference.

## **SUMMARY**

800 garbage collectors have been reached with collection kits

Over 2,045 people have been reached. with more than 650 men accepting to follow Jesus in August.

All people reached up to date: 92,095. All people commitment to the Lord: 41,987.

## **Report on Bmf-Uganda work for August 2023**

.On the 12th August, Kabugo Luke, Tamale Moses and Bizima Derick went to Makerere University Business School, Nebbi Branch, and spoke to 215 students and 25 lecturers. Tamale Moses gave a brief explanation about BMF, followed by his testimony, and then Kabugo Luke gave the main speech. 60 students and 7 lecturers received salvation.

On the 24th August, Jude Musisi and I went to Ndorwa Prison. We arrived there at around midday when the inmates were still outside for labour work. We shared the Word of God with two wardens as we were waiting for the inmates to come back. One of them accepted Jesus as his Saviour, and Jude guided him to the new birth.

The inmates came back at 2pm and the O.C assembled them in the compound under the mango tree at around 3pm. Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 176 men received salvation out of the 213 men enrolled in that unit. We prayed for those who had physical and spiritual needs and I believe God will work for them. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On the 25th August, Jude Musisi and I went to Rubanda Prison. We arrived there at 8am when the inmates were having breakfast. At 8.30am the deputy O.C assembled all the 264 men enrolled in that unit in the compound. Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I started to give my story. In due course, two Muslim men started causing commotion while shouting "Allah Akhbar, Allah Akhbar", and saying that that we were insulting Allah, by saying that Jesus is the Son of God. Thankfully the wardens on guard intervened quickly and took them away. I proceeded with my story and 217 men received salvation. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On the 26th August, Jude Musisi and I went to Mparo Prison. We arrived there at 7:30am when the wardens were preparing garden tools to take the inmates out for labour work. The O.C gave us only one hour to speak to the inmates so that they wouldn't be late for the next programme. He assembled all the 196 men enrolled in that unit outside, Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. The O.C had a bad attitude towards Christians, but he had no way of refusing us to speak to the inmates because we had a permission letter from the Headquarters. Even though the OC told inmates bad things about Christians in our presence, 134 men received salvation after listening to our testimonies. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.
