Report on BMF- UGANDA work for January 2025.

At the beginning of January, Kasamba Jacob received a phone call from two men by the names of Mumbeere Regan, aged 24yrs, and Bwambale Gerald, aged 30yrs, who had just been released from Lusese Prison, asking him where they could meet him. He directed them to where he was. They met him and asked him for a good church which they can join to continue being disciplined, as it was in the prison. He welcomed them into the church he attends. God did a miracle for these men. They were released on the President's Annual Pardon's day, before their sentences were ended..



On 12th January, Kasamba Jacob and Tumukunde Jimmy went to Lusese Prison to continue teaching the discipleship class they started in that uni. They taught 65 men about the story of Joseph when he was in prison.

On 19th January, Jude Musisi and I went to Lira Prison. We arrived in the afternoon when it was too hot outside. The Officer on duty allowed us in and we went into the office of the O.C. He

welcomed us and instructed the Wardens on duty to assemble the 463 men enrolled in that unit under the shade of the tree. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my story. 406 men received salvation, 11 of whom were Muslims. Others who didn't commit their lives to Jesus got annoyed and rebuked those who denounced Islam, and vowed to get revenge, but we left and we don't know what they are planning to do. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 19th January, Kasamba Jacob and Tumukunde Jimmy went to Lake Katwe Prison to continue with the discipleship class they started in that unit. They taught a group of 110 men about the story of the Prodigal Son from the Bible.

On 20th January, Jude Musisi and I went to Olia Prison. We arrived there at 9am, when the inmates were still inside their cells. The Officer on duty assembled all the men enrolled in that unit outside in the open compound. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full testimony. 349 received salvation out of the 381 who were assembled, 5 of whom were Muslims. Jude opened his Bible and taught them how their sins have been washed away by Jesus and he assured them of eternal life. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 21st January, Jude Musisi and I went to Erutu Prison. We arrived there at 8 am when the inmates were still in the morning assembly. The O.C. was still addressing them and so we waited for 15 minutes to start. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 241 men received salvation out of the 273 who were assembled. Jude opened his Bible and taught them to love their enemies and pray for them as Jesus told us in Mathew 5:15, because two men had told him that they are in prison due to their hatred. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 26th January, Kasamba Jacob and Tumukunde Jimmy went to Nyabirongo Prison to continue with the discipleship class they started in that unit. They taught 50 men about the Prodigal Son. After teaching they visited a man by the name of Juma who was part of the discipleship class of that unit and who had been released from the jail. Formally a Muslim, he received salvation on our visit to that prison in September last year. He told them that he had joined a nearby church. They invited him to be baptised together with the two men who were released from Lusese on 31st January, and he accepted.

No. of men reached in January 2025 = 1,117.

No. of men received salvation in January 2025 = 996.

No. of men reached since 2008 = 109,407.

No. of men received salvation since 2008 = 84,761.
