#### **SEPTEMBER OUTREACHES REPORT**

#### 1. GIKAMBURA OUTREACH.

Venue: Deliverance Church, Gikambura.

Friday 12th Sept. from 3pm to 5pm.

About 100 men were present. Main speakers were John Gathecha and Samuel Njogu.

45 men responded to the call of prayer for salvation.

Food stuffs and clothes were donated by well-wishers to the needy families

2. MAI MAHIU OUTREACH IN NAKURU.

Venue: Mai Mahiu open grounds.

Saturday 13th.

The meeting was attended by about 200 men and women drawn mainly from families that suffered the dam floods catastrophe.

Many are still in dire need of support.

Main speakers were Samuel Njogu and Simon Kiarie.

Well-wishers had given us food stuffs and clothes to donate to needy families which were distributed.

Over 100 men and women responded to receive Christ and were prayed for.

#### 3. MAI MAHIU LEADERS TRAINING.

On Monday 15th from 10am to 2pm.

V:enue Mums Hotel:- A training was conducted by Samuel Njogu to 15 leaders of the Mahiu Chapter on how to effectively conduct outreaches in the area. Outreaches targeting lorry drivers and their conductors, and small scale traders were put into place to commence in the month of October.

#### 4. MANANJA COMMUNITY OUTREACH IN MURANGA.

Wed. 17th from 2pm to 5pm.

Venue: Gospel Outreach Church Hall. Attendance: 150 men.

About 50 Mananja Chapter members from 14 new Chapters invited over 100 unsaved men to a meeting that was scheduled to establish dynamic outreaches in the area.

Main speaker was Samuel Njogu.

Over 70 of the invited men responded to the prayer for salvation. More outreaches were planned for the month of October.

#### 5. PRAYER MEETING.

Friday 19th from 10am to 5pm.

Venue: House of Praise Retreat Centre Hall.

16 leaders from the Chapters around Kikuyu were in attendance.

A number of outreaches were prayed for and organised.

#### 6. SCHOOLS OUTREACH TEAM

The ongoing training for the school outreaches team is doing well, supported by BMF.

The team has organised schools outreaches in October.

They have also organised an outreach in Samburu County from Friday 24th to Sunday 27th. (reports to be shared at the end of October).

#### 7. PRAYER REQUESTS

Let us pray for Harrison Kariuki and Paul Kuria both from Thika as they assist in planning outreaches in Thika and the environs. They joined the team of outreach planners in October. Let us pray for John Gathecha of Gikambura Chapter as he assists in planning several outreaches in the Nairobi area.

#### **SEPTEMBER 2025 OUTREACH SUMMARY**

BMF supported the needy with food stuffs in Mai Mahiu and Gikambura Chapter outreaches and the ongoing schools outreach team.

450 men were reached with 215 men accepting to follow Jesus Christ.

### Report on BMF- UGANDA work for October 2025.

On 29th October, Jude Musis and I went to Fort Portal Main Prison. It rained heavily that day and it was still drizzling by the time we arrived there. The Wardens couldn't assemble the inmates outside in the rain, so they had to put them in the main hall which was not big enough to accommodate all the 983 inmates enrolled in that unit at once. The OC advised his staff to bring them in shifts. The first was a group of 490. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 399 men received salvation 21 of whom were Muslims. We prayed for those who had health issues and some of them acknowledged the healing power of Jesus. The second group consisted of 484 men. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF, again followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story again. 413 men received salvation, 14 of whom were Muslims. Jude ministered to them shortly after the meeting and then we donated five boxes of washing soap to that prison at the end.

On 30<sup>th</sup> October, Jude Musis and I went to Rwiimi Prison. We arrived there at 2pm when the inmates were still coming back from labour work. We waited for an hour for them to bathe and have a meal. Afterwards the Officers on duty assembled them outside in the compound. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 564 received salvation out of the 615 men who were in the assembly, 17 of whom were Muslims. We prayed for all of them and donated five boxes of washing soap to that prison at the end. On 31st October, Jude Musisi and I went to Bukwanga Prison. It was a very slow journey from Fort Portal City to Bundibujo Town, where that prison is located, because the road is switched-back. We arrived there at 1pm. We had last visited this prison in 2018, and no gospel preachers like to go to that area because of the nature of the roads which are going there and the insecurity which

is caused by rebels from DRC. The OC assembled all the men enrolled in that unit outside. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story, but none of them had ever heard about the word being born-again. They had much more knowledge about Islam, and over 100 were true Muslims. because most of them were in prison with regard to cases related to conniving or working with the rebel group which is based in the DRC forest, which is near there, yet that group is for Islamic terrorists. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. We ministered to them after telling our stories to convince them how their sins were washed away by the blood of Jesus, and at the end, 216 men received salvation out of the



244 men enrolled in that unit, 103 of whom were Muslims. We donated five boxes of washing soap to that prison and we promised to send them two Bibles through the Prisons Administration because they need to understand more about Christianity.

No. of men received salvation since 2008 = 92,788.
