Report on BMF- UGANDA work for April 2024.

On 27th April, Jude Musisi and I went to Lugore Prison. It was raining and our vehicle got stuck in the sliding mud along the way for about an hour. but God helped us and we got out of there. We arrived at the prison at 12pm. The O.C welcomed us. It was still drizzling, so it was not easy to assemble the inmates outside in the bad weather. We waited until the weather got better and we started our meeting. 263 men were assembled outside in the compound, Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 241 men received salvation. Jude took fifteen minutes more to read the Scriptures, while explaining to men how they have made a right choice, at the right time, to accept Jesus as their Saviour, and he assured them to expect a complete change of everything in their lives if they continue believing.

We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 28th April, Jude Musisi and I went to Pece Prison. We arrived there at 10am when the inmates were inside their cells. The Officer on duty instructed all the men to gather in the hall which they use as their dining place. Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 316 men received salvation out of the 363 men enrolled in that unit. After our speeches, I connected my laptop to the on-line service which was going on in



our church in Kampala. The Pastor in our church was aware that new believers were listening to his sermon, and he delivered an encouraging message to them which strengthened their belief, and most of them promised God to believe in Jesus for the rest of their lives. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 29th April, Jude Musisi and I went to Lamusa Prison. We arrived there at 8am. We had made an appointment with the O.C a day before and agreed to be there early so that we could meet the inmates before they are taken out for labour work. We found that they were already in the morning assembly. Jude Musisi gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. Out of 274 men who were present in the assembly, 236 men received salvation, four of whom were Muslims, I shared with them about different real stories of Muslims in our country murdering Christians who preach the Gospel. One of them told us that it is part of the secret Islamic teaching in Uganda to reduce the number of Muslims who are renouncing Islam and turning to Christianity. He also told us that even he was taught this by his Imams, and has been in the position of doing so before listening to our message. We donated five boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to that prison at the end.

No. of men received in April 2024 = 793.

No. of men reached since 2008. = 103,108.

No. of men received salvation since 2008 = 79,297.
